Short Description: ECotality, through the EV Project, offers EVSE at no cost to individuals living in specified areas.

Beneficiary: Individuals living in the Washington, DC metropolitan area who purchase a qualified electric vehicle (EV) or plug-in hybrid electric vehicle (PHEV)

Type of Incentive: Free EVSE

Effective Dates: Current benefit

Value of Benefit: Cost of EVSE

Full Description:

Through the EV Project, ECotality offers EVSE at no cost to individuals in the Washington, DC metropolitan area. To be eligible for free home charging stations, individuals must purchase an EV or PHEV. Qualified vehicles include the Nissan Leaf. Individuals purchasing an eligible EV or PHEV should apply at the dealership at the time of vehicle purchase. The EV Project incentive program will also cover most, if not all, of the costs of the EVSE installation. However, all participants in the EV Project incentive program must agree to anonymous data collections after installation. Additional restrictions may apply.
